Clinical Scope of Practice

The International Travel Clinic (ITC) prepares Sandia National Laboratories (SNL) employees and/or contractors performing SNL business internationally for work-related foreign travel.

ITC SERVICES INCLUDE:

Review for destination country recommendations based on the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines.

Assess SNL international traveler's health status prior to travel. Review current medications, drug allergies, and update medical/surgical history.

Assess health risks associated with destination country and provide recommended and/or required immunizations based on the destination country.

Provide education for insect precautions and/or malaria chemoprophylaxis.

Offer and provide education for a medication pack for self-treatment of common travel illnesses in high-risk countries with substandard medical care.

Provide education and distribution of International SOS (ISOS) cards for worldwide emergency assistance.

Comply with national and state reporting requirements and continue monitoring of traveler's health status upon return to the U.S. (such as Ebola, etc.).

Provide disease risk mitigation through patient education using resources provided by Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and World Health Organization (WHO).

Encourage participation of frequent international travelers in the voluntary medical surveillance program, Frequent International Travel (FIT) program (OP-MED081)

Encourage participation in the Tuberculosis (TB) Surveillance Program
